




ESN is the key student volunteer organisation in Europe

ERASMUS CHARTER FOR HIGHER EDUCATION 2021-2027

Guidelines

- Implement the priorities of the Programme:
 - By promoting civic engagement and encouraging students and staff to get involved as active citizens before, during and after their participation in a mobility or project.

HEIs should organise or promote activities/projects that enhance the active citizenship skills and competences of students and staff, for instance the Erasmus Student Network's SocialErasmus Project. This project aims to better integrate international exchange students in the local society by organising volunteer opportunities to ensure an exchange of values takes place between the international students and the local community. Another example is the ESAA-funded project WE AfriHug, which aims to promote European and international understanding through the Erasmus+ Programme.


ESN recently conducted the XV edition of the ESN survey, the biggest student-led research focusing on the fields of international mobility & the internationalization of education.

These are some of the key findings out of the more than 23,000 answers received.



The Priorities of the Erasmus + Programme

Erasmus+ priorities: Students believe in the programme and consider it lives up to its priorities

69%


Agree (38%) or strongly agree (31%) with "Erasmus+ encourages civic engagement during exchanges"

The new Erasmus+ programme has highlighted once more the **importance**of civic engagement through learning mobility, but it also pointed
attention to the long-lasting challenge of facilitating the **interaction**between international students and their local communities. On
average, only 10% of students engaged in volunteering activities during
their exchange.

Better structural support to student and alumni organisations on the ground, better recognition of volunteering opportunities.









Our Participants

A small number of ESN volunteers make a key difference. 62% of our audience are international students, and 32% are local youth through outreach activities.


Before and After Mobility - Identity of Erasmus+ Students' Citizenship

How likely is it that you would vote in the European Parliament elections in June 2024?





As the European Parliament Elections approach, our exchange students were surveyed on their motivations to vote in the near-term European Parliament elections. After analysing the results, 66% are motivated to do so, with 45% being extremely likely and 21% likely to vote.


