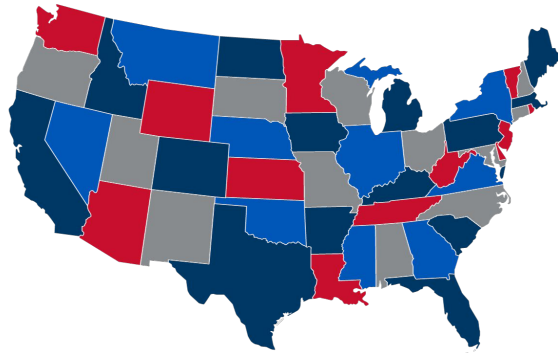
We offer accurate, comprehensive and current information about opportunities for U.S. study at accredited higher education institutions.

- The U.S. is the top destination for international students, with 1,057,188 international students in 2022-2023.

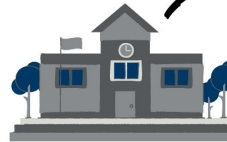


Undergraduate (*Grado*) Programs in the U.S.

- Need to complete high school studies (equivalent to 3^o-4^o ESO, 1^o-2^o *Bachillerato*) to access undergraduate studies
- 4 year degree programs
 - First two years are mostly general education courses
 - Second two years focus on your major (*carrera/especialización*)
- Will earn Bachelor's Degree, most commonly a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) or Bachelor of Science (B.S.)

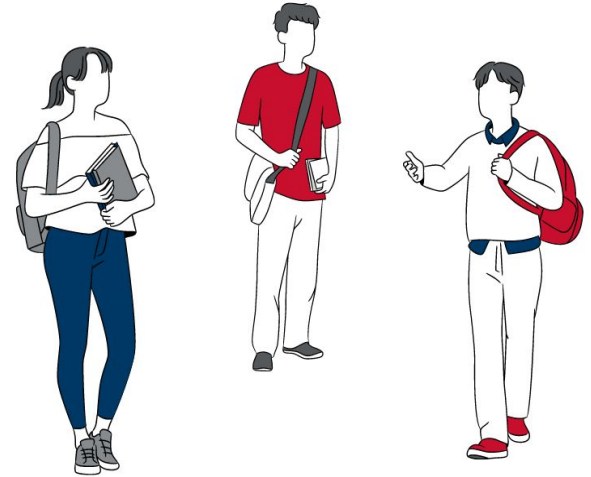

The U.S. Admissions Process is Holistic

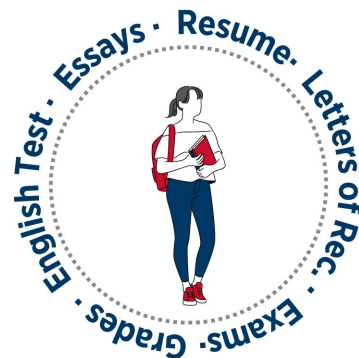
Essentially, universities want to know:

- Will the student succeed academically?
- What will the student potentially contribute to the campus community (intellectually, socially, etc.)?



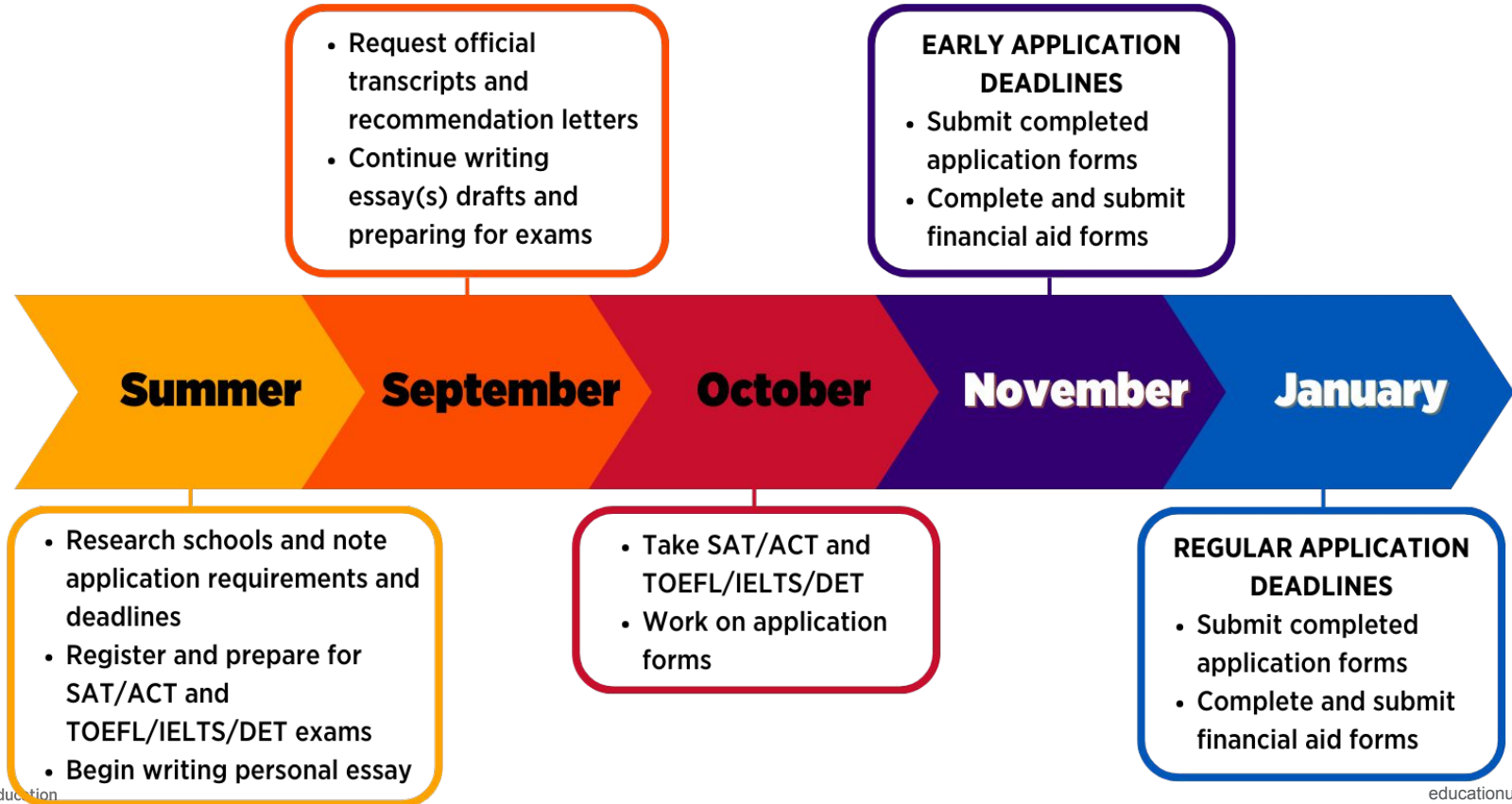
General components of an Application

- Application form
 - Standardized like Common App or via the university's own platform
- Official High School (3^o-4^o ESO, 1-2^o Bachillerato) Transcripts, in English
- Personal Essay(s)
- Extracurriculars List
- Recommendation Letters from counselor and teacher(s)
- English Exam (TOEFL/IELTS/DET)
- Standardized Exams (SAT/ACT)



Each university sets their own application requirements.

General Application Timeline - 2^o Bachillerato



Admission

- Admissions notifications are usually sent in March-April
- Confirm your attendance with the university by May 1 and receive your I-20 document
- Apply for a student visa and do visa interview at the U.S. Embassy in Madrid
